

The FIDE Congress Arbiters' Commission Meeting was held on 2nd August 2022 from 09:05 to 11:05 (local time) in the Royal Ball Room, Leela Palace Hotel in Chennai, and on the official FIDE Zoom Platform.

There were about 100 participants on site, and about 130 participants on Zoom who attended the meeting: FIDE President Mr. Arkady Dvorkovich, FIDE Council Members, Delegates, Commission Members, Representatives of National and Continental Arbiters' Councils, etc.

3. Introduction and Opening Words

3.1. Introductory word by FIDE President Arkady Dvorkovich



The FIDE President Arkady Dvorkovich welcomed all participants to the FIDE Congress in Chennai and pointed out that he was glad to see so many people present at the ARB meeting. He said that the ARB Commission was very important for the FIDE, for keeping the integrity of whole system of FIDE Tournaments. He also thanked everyone who worked on the development of the arbiters' system, and new Regulations, as well as for their work on major and other FIDE tournaments, organizing seminars, etc. He specifically mentioned

Online tournaments and the Regulations for Online tournaments.

The FIDE President discussed the vision of FIDE and the ARB Commission, the development of the arbiters' sector, a stable system of titles and categories, the importance of organizing training of arbiters, equal representation of arbiters from all continents and federations and gender, etc. He insisted on the need for continents to align their working system on the selection of arbiters in official events; the design of an efficient system of evaluation of arbiters and the organisation of independent exams for arbiters.

Once again, he thanked everyone for their attention and participation in the ARB meeting and he wished a successful meeting and reiterated his willingness to get involved in the consideration of the most important issues in the area of activity of the Arbiters Commission.

3.2. Introductory word by ARB Honorary Chairman Takis Nikolopoulos

The Honorary Chairman Takis Nikolopoulos welcomed all participants and mentioned that we had an opportunity to meet again after 4 years. He thanked the whole ARB Team for their excellent and hard work during the very difficult Covid period. Progress had been made in many fields and we had a lot of work to do in the future. He encouraged all arbiters to work together to achieve those goals.



He specifically emphasized the hard work on reviewing the title

application, preparing the Arbiters' Manual, work of the Educational team and administrative work as well. He added that the number of arbiters had suddenly increased to more than 16000. It meant that a lot of people had interest in being an arbiter, and it was not possible to make all those people happy with their positions. The commission wanted to listen to everyone, but it could not agree with all proposals and personal wishes. There were experts intrigued to finding the best solutions for all arbiters. He ended his speech by saying that he was very optimistic about the commission's work.

3.3. Introductory word by ARB Chairman Laurent Freyd



The Chairman Laurent Freyd welcomed all participants, thanking them for joining the morning early in the morning and saluted the All India Chess Federation for hosting the Olympiad and FIDE Congress in Chennai, providing a welcome atmosphere to all participants. He also mentioned the pleasure of being hosted in India for the first congress commission meeting of the mandate.

The Chairman highlighted the "gens una sumus" spirit that reigned in the team, as members of the commission volunteered so much of their time and passion for the development of the ARB. Also, the FIDE

Lecturers were recognised for their constant involvement when they are invited by the commission.

The Chairman emphasized that changes in regulations are never thought to deprive colleagues from what they previously achieved; to the contrary, new changes are meant to bring opportunities, when it doesn't go against quality. As an illustration, the new regulations for arbiters now allow 1 FA or IA norm for 25 players in a tournament, while it was previously 1 for 50. In any case, federations are consulted before a significant change is submitted for a vote by the FIDE Council.

The next highlight about strengthening the foundations of the commission was on training and quality, reducing the variability among exams, which are for now still made individually by each lecturer. The Chairman echoed the words of the FIDE President to target centralised exams as the next step of development and ability for lecturers to focus on teaching.

The Chairman then reminded the audience about the new processes implemented during the mandate:

- The Lecturer Training Programme, which is a way to build a community of lecturers who are together more responsible of their "professional development" and stronger when they work together as a real community.
- The selection of arbiters for World events (panels), bringing a global data driven view on the process, through an open call of interest, concepts of rotation, gender and geographical representation. As an illustration for the Olympiad alone, the number of federations represented in Chennai that were neither present in Batumi nor Baku was 19, for a total of 149 federations represented among the last 3 Olympiads.
- Panels of arbiters should not be limited to be a list of names, but contribute to the development of the sector. Online sessions were already organised with the members of the green panel to work together on open questions like the role and duties of arbiters in tournaments. That will be a foundation for the design of a proper evaluation system.
- New training offers were proposed, adapting to the context: Online and Hybrid seminars saw 2 arbiters per federation sponsored by the FIDE development fund, as part of a capacity building strategy; a new concept of training, to better prepare the team for the Olympiad was organised in the past week and should be made a standard for the future. IA seminars and refresher courses are coming next.
- A training portal was introduced, which onboarded already 2000 colleagues and the ambition is that the system becomes the reference to find training resources for arbiters.

Before concluding, the Chairman emphasized on *Team Play*. Whether it is by being a development actor supporting federations in need for their national curriculum or through cross commission work, collaboration with other actors is key and the ARB always tries to have a global view for a healthy development of the sector.

3.4. Introductory word by ARB Secretary Nebojsa Baralic

The Secretary Nebojsa Baralic welcomed and thanked all participants for their participation. After that, he shortly mentioned all aspects and topics of the Arbiter Commission's work. He spoke about his personal experiences in the work and he presented numerous statistical data on the number of commission meetings and other processes. The Commission organized over 100 different meetings in last 3,5 years (ARB Monthly meetings, Councillors meetings, Education Team meetings, Titles Team meetings, Manuel Team meetings, cross Commissions meetings, individual meetings, etc.). This was the best indicator that the ARB Commission had been working as a team and that almost all members had been involved in Commissions' work.



Special part of his speech was dedicated to the new Regulations and the process of their preparation. It was the teamwork of all members of the Arbiters' Commission, FIDE officials, other FIDE Commissions and all Federations. After numerous consultations, meetings, and feedback from the Federations, the new Regulations were accepted. The FIDE Council approved the new Regulations, and they have been valid from 1st July 2022.

After that, he spoke about other administrative processes, and he thanked the Chairman Laurent Freyd. Thanks to several software, tools and databases, administrative work is now much easier than in the beginning. He pointed out that the goal was to automate the licensing process in the future with the help of the FIDE IT office. Also, he mentioned that the ARB Website was a very important tool in work of the ARB and everyone could find all-important information there. The new ARB website was moved online on August 18th, 2020, and all posts and information were transferred from the old website (nearly 1200 posts at that time).

At the end of his speech, he mentioned that the ARB Commission is in service for arbiters all over the world, for all national arbiters' commissions and federations. He added that the ARB Commission is in charge of respecting all FIDE regulations, Arbiters' Regulations, and it is determined to make progress every day. Step by step!

4. Obituary

The Secretary of the Arbiters' Commission Nebojsa Baralic was in charge for the "In memoriam" part. Unfortunately, the list "In memoriam" included the names of 17 International Arbiters who passed away after the 92nd FIDE Online Congress 2021. He added that this was a sad part but very important for ARB Commission, and that they deserved to have their names mentioned here.

He read all the names of the deceased arbiters and asked everyone to take a few moments to think about them before moving on to other topics.

5. ARB Commission Activities (informative Report)

5.1. Education Sector



As the leader of the ARB Education Sector, Alex McFarlane talked about this very important area. He confirmed everything that Chairman Laurent Freyd said before, and added that Education Team would continue the progress with all topics: standardizing exams for FA Seminars, starting the Refresher Courses and IA Seminars, improving standard of arbiters, etc.

About the new project in education of arbiters, World Event Preparation, were explained by Councillor Omar Salama. He reminded everyone that ARB Commission decided to start with

preparation of arbiters before the big FIDE events. This project was initially about to start before the 2020 Olympiad, but due to Covid, this program was being implemented for the first time in Chennai. After the arbiters team for the Olympiad was formed, three arbiters' training sessions were organized, two online and one in the playing hall in Chennai, one day before the start the tournament. The last meeting consisted of several particularly useful parts. First, all arbiters in the plenary session were introduced to the most important



details related to the duties of the arbiters, and then each sector arbiter continued the preparation with his team in separate sessions.

Finally, he added that this project would continue in the future, before all big FIDE events.

The Chairman of the Arbiters' Commission Laurent Freyd added that Omar Salama designed this project in a way that was well fitted with the needs and that it was a very useful project for the preparation of arbiters. He thanked Omar for his hard work.

5.2. Arbiters' Manual



The Councillor of the Arbiters' Commission and the leader of the Arbiters Manual Team Shohreh Bayat spoke about Arbiters' Manual. She mentioned that this job started many years ago by the previous Arbiters' Commission and the Arbiters' Manual had been a great tool for all arbiters around the world. She thanked all contributors who helped in that progress.

After that, she spoke about how the Manual was improved. We started with a call of interest and collected many proposals from our colleagues, federations, and other commissions. There was a big team working on Manual's regular updates.

The new edition of the Manual was updated with:

- B01 International Title Regulations (effective form 1st January 2022)
- B02 FIDE Rating Regulations (effective from 1st January 2022)
- B02 FIDE Rapid and Blitz Rating Regulations (effective from 1st January 2022)
- B06 FIDE Regulations for Arbiters (effective form 1st July 2021)
- Forms update (IA1, IA2, IA3, FA1, FA2)

Chapter B06 contained updated regulations for Titles (B06.1), Training (B06.2), Classification (B06.3) and a new chapter on the Selection of Arbiters in World Events (B06.4).

The Arbitrators Manual was a good example of cross-commission cooperation: Rules Commission, Qualification Commission, Fair play Commission, Technical Commission participated in its development.

She added that the Arbiters' Commission would continue to work on Arbiters' Manual and she invited all arbiters to participate in this process and make Arbiters' Manual better.

5.3. Titles Sector

The Secretary of the Arbiters' Commission Nebojsa Baralic spoke about the Titles team activities lately, between the two FIDE Council meetings. He mentioned that the leader of the ARB Titles Team, member of the ARB Commission, Jens Wolter was not available to come in Chennai and he thanked him for great and hard work on this topic.

He informed the audience that ARB Title Teams reviewed 187 applications for the 2nd FIDE Council. Large number of applications (52) had administrative gaps that we tried to correct. In cooperation with federations, we fixed 34 of 52. The rest of them (18) were postponed to the 3rd FIDE Council, they were not rejected.

He also reminded everyone present that the Arbiters' Commission organized a webinar and that the recording has still been available on the Internet. He asked everyone present to inform their rating administrators to watch that webinar again and that if they had any questions, they should have feel free to contact the Commission and we would help them.

The Chairman of the Arbiters' Commission Laurent Freyd clarified the titles reviewing process and spoke about plans for the future, how to improve this process so it can easier for all actors. After that, he informed participants that the number of license requests and for the organization of seminars was approximately similar before the Covid pandemic. In addition, an interesting information was that the number of applications for female arbiters' licenses has currently been 20% instead of 15% before the Covid, which was an encouraging message.

Then, there were a few questions and suggestions from the participants about the title applications.

6. FIDE Arbiters' Awards

The Secretary of the Arbiters' Commission Nebojsa Baralic announced the nominees of the 2022 FIDE Arbiters' Awards. The proposal of the Arbiters' Commission was to send it to the FIDE Council for the final approval. The Awards would be sent to their federations after the end of the Congress.

7. Test of arbiters

The Chairman of the Arbiters' Commission Laurent Freyd explained this item and its importance for the process of understanding the level of arbiters' skills, expectations for the FIDE arbiters' exam and for the International arbiters' exam. The idea was to make the test for the Olympiad arbiters which covered various technical topics (Arbiters' knowledge, English, etc.). Then we should have used the results to better understand the general level of skills for FA and IA on a panel of about 200 colleagues. As using colleagues as "test sample" for the commission could be a sensitive subject, we had decided not to make such an evaluation before hearing the opinion of the arbiters' community during this meeting.

There was a discussion about this topic and participants had many suggestions. There was a global consensus that such an initiative would not be a personal test, but rather anonymous, to give proper measurements to the ARB without putting titled colleagues in an uncomfortable position.

8. Future of arbiter titles

The Chairman of the Arbiters' Commission Laurent Freyd informed everyone present that the Arbiters' Commission received two proposals from the National Chess Federation of the Philippines. He asked Mr. Abundo Casto to present the proposals.

The delegate from the Philippines, Mr. Casto Abundo, skipped the first proposal and directly spoke about their second proposal (Proposal-to-FIDE-Congress-re-Arbiters-Reg-3_11.pdf). He mentioned the differences in the possibilities of organizing chess events with participants from more than one federation between continents and federations. He added that the current articles (2.6.2 and 3.11) in the Regulations were acceptable for Europe, but not for Africa, America and Asia.

Various participants in the audience gave their opinion about using tournaments with a single federation represented and there was a global consensus that the FIDE Arbiter title should be considered "developmental" while a higher level of quality and expectations should be reserved to the International Arbiter title.

It was decided to support lowering the expectations for FIDE Arbiters to the FIDE Council.

9. Miscellaneous

Due to the meeting running out of time, no other topics were discussed during the meeting.

Finally, the Chairman Laurent Freyd thanked all participants of the meeting, especially the ARB team and those who participated in the presentations. He also wished everyone good health and hoped to see them soon again.
